Dear Parent/Guardian

Re: Y7 Geography - Natural History Museum and London Eye - Wednesday 24 April &/or Wednesday 1 May 2024

In order to enrich the Geography curriculum and support the teaching of natural hazards, ecosystems and the UK, the Wildern School Geography Department has organised a trip to the Natural History Museum. Students will be able to explore the exhibitions and further their knowledge of many topics that we study during KS3. Students will also be taken on the London Eye to see the human and physical geographical features of London.

Due to previous high uptake, two identical trips have been planned. 50 students will attend on each date. If your child is successful, they will be randomly selected to attend on either Wednesday 24 April **or** Wednesday 1 May 2024.

If fewer than 100 students apply, two separate trips will not be economical to run so we will resort to one trip (Wednesday 24 April 2024) and 50 students will be drawn. This will also take into account students who may have missed out on geography trips previously.

In the event of oversubscription we will endeavour to take into consideration any students who may have missed out on trips previously due to oversubscription, and will allocate any further places by drawing names out of a hat. In the event of a place not being allocated, any monies received will be returned.

When taking a trip we take as many students as possible within the constraints we are bound by. We have to consider venue restrictions, travel arrangements and the impact on the rest of the school when staff are taken out of their curriculum areas to support a trip. Staff running and supporting our school trips often do this outside of their working hours and do so voluntarily. As a school we work extremely hard to get this balance right for all parties involved.

The cost will be £45.00 per student. This is to cover the coach hire and the ticket for the London Eye. Students will be supervised by members of the Geography Department at all times.

All students will require a packed lunch and a water bottle. If your child is entitled to a free school lunch, this will be provided for them.

Students will be representing the school on this trip so the highest standards of behaviour will be expected. Students are required to wear school uniform but can wear comfortable footwear.

The coach will leave Wildern School promptly at 7.30am and will return by coach at approximately 6:30pm. We ask your child to be at school at 7:15am to meet the coach.

Please complete the parental agreement form online through your Parentpay account to give consent for your child to attend this trip. You will be asked to provide your emergency contact details and any relevant medical information. If a deposit, or full payment, is required this will also

need to be paid at the time. If you have not already activated your Parentpay account and require your login details please do not hesitate to contact the Finance Office at finance@wildern.org. If you have been notified that we as a school receive Pupil Premium funding for your child, the cost of this trip will be covered. If this is the case, your Parentpay account will automatically reflect this but please complete the consent, emergency contact information and medical details through Parentpay as usual. The same procedures regarding oversubscription for the trip will apply.

If you would like your child to attend please complete the online Parentpay medical and consent section accompanied by a payment of £45.00 by Friday 16 February 2024
