Re: Bletchley Park - Thursday 15 May 2025

We will be running a trip to Bletchley Park, the home of British codebreaking and a birthplace of modern Information Technology, for year 7 students, on Thursday 15 May 2025.

Students will spend the day learning about how Alan Turing, the Founder of Computer Science, created the "Bombe" which helped crack the Enigma code helping the allies win WWII. Students will also explore mathematical encryption and encoding techniques that have been used throughout history, tackling complex processes to solve a code breaking challenge. The workshop includes a unique opportunity to see a genuine Enigma machine and be introduced to its design and role in WWII.

Places on the trip are limited to 48. We will be leaving school at 7.30am and returning back to school by approx. 4.30pm. The trip will cost £44.00 for the day, including transport.

The activities will mainly be inside but due to the nature of the site, wet weather clothing is advised and full school uniform is compulsory.

Students will be representing the school on this trip so the highest standards of behaviour will be expected.

All students will require a packed lunch and a water bottle. If your child is entitled to a free school lunch, this will be provided for them. An area will be provided for the students to eat their packed lunch.

Please complete the relevant sections on ParentPay to give consent for your child to attend this trip. You will be asked to provide your emergency contact details and any relevant medical information. If a deposit, or full payment, is required this will also need to be paid at the time. If you have been notified that we as a school receive Pupil Premium funding for your child, the cost of this trip will be covered. The same procedures regarding oversubscription for the trip will apply.

There are 48 places available. In the event of oversubscription we will endeavour to take into consideration any students who may have missed out on trips previously due to oversubscription, and will allocate any further places by drawing names out of a hat. In the event of a place not being allocated, any monies received will be returned.

When taking a trip we take as many students as possible within the constraints we are bound by. We have to consider venue restrictions, travel arrangements and the impact on the rest of the school when staff are taken out of their curriculum areas to support a trip. Staff running and supporting our school trips often do this outside of their working hours and do so voluntarily. As a school we work extremely hard to get this balance right for all parties involved.
