My name is Mr Legg, Subject Learning Co-ordinator for Music. Mrs Thomas (Director of the Wildern Music Academy) and I are very much looking forward to welcoming your child to our department at Wildern for their first year of KS3. We have a very exciting program planned for Year 7 including studying Singing, Program Music, African Drumming, Riffs and Hooks, and The Axis of Awesome.

The Music department aims to provide an inclusive, positive and enjoyable curriculum where student's well-being, achievement and life skills are at the centre. By participating in music, students develop core skills essential to them now and in later life such as discipline, teamwork, communication and listening, organisation, perseverance, resilience and creativity.
