





This year we saw the launch of Millionaire Readers an initiative whereby students read a set number of books (25) in

order to achieve millionaire status across the academic year. Most secondary books in the LRC and for 11-16 generally average about 40,000 words per book, so 25 books would make them a millionaire reader. 




