

The Impact of Degrees on Earnings

Difference in lifetime earnings between graduates and non-graduates (once taxes and student loans are taken into account):

- £130k for men
- £100k for women

A gain in average net lifetime earnings of around 20% for both men and women



The Wider Benefits of University

- Universities UK data (July 2023):

- 97% of business leaders polled revealed that graduates reach managerial positions faster as a result of going to university
- 71% of business leaders also believe that going to university enables graduates to build vital transferable skills

- The Wellbeing of Graduates (Nov 2017):

- Graduates tend to be more satisfied with their lives than non-graduates; however, they
 also tend to be more anxious across all income levels than people who have no
 qualifications above A-level.
- Graduates tend to find their lives more worthwhile and be happier than non-graduates.

The Wider Benefits of University

According to The Lancet Public Health journal (Jan' 2024):

- Every year spent in school or university improves our life expectancy
- An adult's risk of mortality went down by 2% for every year in full-time education



- Use average GCSE Score to *help* determine suitability for course, but each student will be treated as an individual
- GCSE English and Maths to those that have achieved a 4 or lower


